Call for applications 11th ZONTA STEM Award

II. Background of processing / Indication of the purpose for which the personal data are to be processed / Legal basis of processing / Recipients of the personal data:

1. Within the framework of the call for applications for the 11th ZONTA STEM Award, JKU processes the personal data of the applicant(s) stated in the respective applications and the enclosures for the handling of JKU's internal processes in relation to the call for applications – in case of awarding the prize also for the reporting of the award ceremony on JKU's website – as well as for internal evaluation purposes. In addition, personal data of the applicant(s) will be forwarded to ZONTA Club Linz for handling the award and for public outreach and documenting purposes.

2. The legal basis for processing and forwarding of the personal data of the applicant(s) is the required processing for fulfilling the rights and obligations inherent in the agreement made with the applicant(s) in relation to the call for applications (cf. article 6 paragraph 1 letter b GDPR) as well as the legitimate interest of JKU and ZONTA Club Linz in reporting the awarding of the 11th ZONTA STEM award in their external communication. Added to this, legitimate prevailing interests of JKU in accordance with article 6 paragraph 1 letter f GDPR in conjunction with article 14 (UG) (Evaluation and Quality Assurance) also justify that persons applying for the 11th ZONTA STEM award within its framework provide data required not only for the assessment in relation to granting the award but also for internal evaluation purposes.

There is no obligation to provide the personal data, but in the event of failure to do so, participation in the call for applications will not be possible.

In so far as any sensitive data mentioned in the relevant application or annexes are processed, the legal basis for the processing of such personal data is based on the consent of the data subject. The data subject shall have the right to withdraw his or her consent to the processing of sensitive data at any time, in writing, without prejudice to the lawfulness of the processing carried out on the basis of the consent until revoked.

3. Recipients of personal data are the organizational units of JKU necessary for the corresponding processing – in particular the Human Resources Development, Gender & Diversity Management Department – as well as ZONTA Club Linz; in addition, submitted application documents will be forwarded to the jury consisting of three JKU members and three members of ZONTA Club.

Personal data of the awardees (especially first and last name and field of study) will – in the event of the award of the prize or – be processed exclusively for the purposes described in Section II.1. and published on the website of JKU and the website of ZONTA Club Linz and thus made accessible to everyone. Due to the worldwide availability of such personal data, it can be found with search engines, linked with other

information, and also copied and reprocessed for other purposes not covered by the enclosed data protection declaration. Against this background, the personal data can also be found elsewhere, even after erasure on the original website or social media channels. JKU has no influence over this and therefore assumes no liability.

III. Indication of the criteria for determining the storage period:

The personal data will be stored by JKU for the duration of legal retention periods as well as until the expiry of the limitation periods of potential legal claims. Afterwards, the data will be deleted unless there are other legitimate interests of JKU that justify further storage.

IV. Information on the rights of the data subjects:

According to the GDPR, data subjects have the following rights:

- Right to information
- Right to correction and erasure
- Right to restriction of processing
- Right to object
- Right to data portability

V. Right of appeal to the Data Protection Authority:
